My dear Doctor Roig:

I thank you for your communication of January eleventh and the excellent -- very excellent -- translation enclosed. It gave me, in concise form, the information I needed.

Your letter was written prior to the promulgation of the instructions, regulations and recommendations of His Excellency, the President of Cuba, the Supreme Court and the Central Electoral Board. I shall desire very much to know whether any of the difficulties and obstructions of which you complain continue after the Audiencias are in receipt of these instructions, regulations and recommendations.

You know the view I take as to the applicability of the Law of Civil Procedure. It is made purely supplementary and its precepts are silent when not in harmony with the precepts of the Electoral Code.

Major Connor reciprocates your greeting and was pleased to receive it.
